4. FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of first aid measures

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Inhalation

Move to fresh air. Keep patient warm and at rest. If effects occur, consult a physician.

Skin contact

Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. Call a poison Control center or doctor for treatment advice if effects persist.

Eye contact

Hold eyes open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, and then continue rinsing eyes. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice if effects persist.

Ingestion

Swallowing: If the patient is conscious, induce vomiting. Do not give anything by mouth when he is conscious. Call a doctor and take the medicine label and packaging together.

Antidote: There is no special antidote. Symptomatic treatment is applied..
