## 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

### 4.1 Description of first aid measures

#### General advice

Move out of dangerous area. Place and transport victim in stable position (lying sideways).  
Remove contaminated clothing immediately and dispose of safely.

#### Inhalation

Move to fresh air. Keep patient warm and at rest. If effects occur, consult a physician.

#### Skin contact

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Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. Call a poison Control center or doctor for treatment advice if effects persist.

### **Eye contact**

Hold eyes open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, and then continue rinsing eyes. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice if effects persist.

### **Ingestion**

Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by the poison control center or doctor. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Get medical attention immediately.

**NOTE:** There is no specific antidote. Treat symptomatically.
